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5th Bi-Annual Project Award Winners - 2018

The GCAO Project Awards started in 2010 and was designed to recognize projects that were built in the Ottawa & Surrounding communities. The awards focus was to recognize projects that showed innovation in construction, technical ability to construct, and economic, social and environmental improvements in the quality of life of the public.

This was the fifth bi-annual project award presentation which occurred at the Brookstreet Hotel. This year the GCAO had a total of 6 submissions, 1 of which was for the Category A – Projects Under \$5 million, 1 submissions were Category A – Projects From \$5 Million to \$15 Million in Value and 2 submission for Category A – Projects Over \$15 million. The following is a summary of the entries:

- 1. Projects up to \$5 million in value:
 - a. Carleton University's McOdrum Library Renovation- McDonald Bros Construction Ltd
- 2. Projects from \$5 million to \$15 million in value:
 - a. Breast Health Centre at the Ottawa Hospital FRECON Construction
- 3. Projects greater than \$15 million in value:
 - a. Carpenter's Union 93 Training Centre in Kanata M. Sullivan & Sons Ltd.
 - b. Expansion & Renovation of the National Arts Centre PCL Constructors Canada

The Panel of Adjudicators who ranked the entries in accordance with a long list of criteria including project management, safety, scheduling, complexity, innovations, customer satisfaction, and contribution to the area's economic, social and environmental quality of life. The Panel members were:

Don Chutter Meritorious Achievement Award

The *Don Chutter Meritorious Achievement Award* was presented to the submission that best demonstrates the contribution of General Contracting to our quality of life in Ottawa. The judging panel considered the project which excels in all areas of the rated criteria and is also an Ottawa and Surrounding Region Project. The criteria for consideration was four different but related aspects of the submitting firm's role in the project:

- Project objectives, solutions and achievements;
- Technical excellence and innovation;
- Level of difficulty; and
- Contribution to economic, social or environmental quality of life
